We've made it simple for you to include a giving aspect in your next children's message series, vacation Bible school, or another amazing idea!

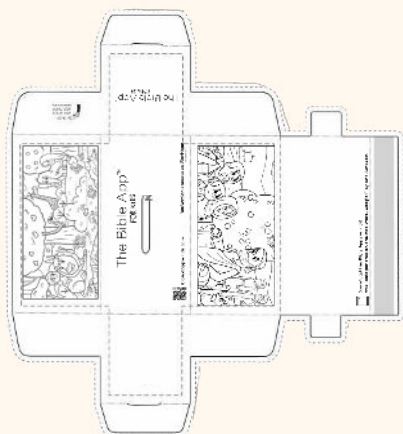
Here are ways to get started.

SECOND, PICK YOUR GEAR!

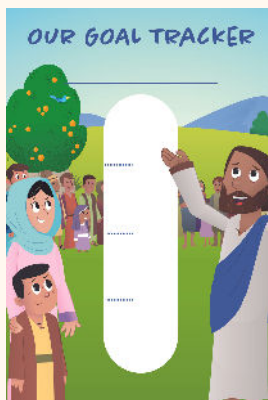
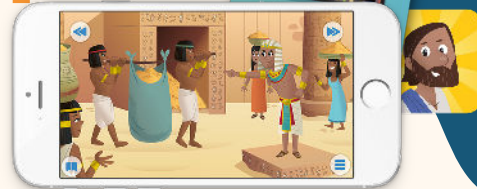

collect coins for the mission.



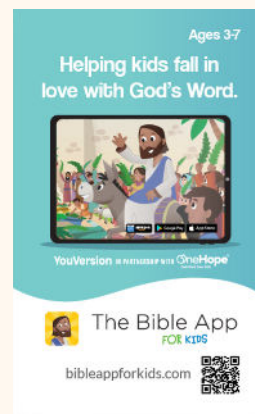
