1.

INFLUENCE—the ability to persuade people to work together for a greater goal.

“Whoever works to do good will find love and loyalty. It is a mistake to work at doing evil.” (Proverbs 14:22)

2.

INTEGRITY—being truthful by living in a way where your actions and words match.

“People with integrity walk safely, but those who follow crooked paths will be exposed.” (Proverbs 10:9)

3.

ATTITUDE—a feeling expressed by behavior.

“Joyful is the person who finds wisdom, the one who gains understanding.” (Proverbs 3:13)

4.

VISION—an aspiration, a goal, or an idea that guides your life.

“Good planning and hard work lead to prosperity, but hasty shortcuts lead to poverty.” (Proverbs 21:5)

5.

SELF-DISCIPLINE—the ability to control your feelings and actions.

“A person without self-control is like a city with broken-down walls.” (Proverbs 25:28)

6.

TIMING—knowing the best time to take action.

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take.” (Proverbs 3:5-6)

7.

RELATIONSHIPS—adding value to people and putting them first.

“As iron sharpens iron, so a friend sharpens a friend.” (Proverbs 22:6)

8.

INITIATIVE— taking positive action.

“A prudent person foresees danger and takes precautions. The simpleton goes blindly on and suffers the consequences.” (Proverbs 27:12)

9.

COMMUNICATION—connecting with people in a way that clearly brings them to understanding.

“From a wise mind comes wise speech; the words of the wise are persuasive.” (Proverbs 16:23)

10.

RESPONSIBILITY—the ability to make and keep commitments.

“Don’t excuse yourself by saying, ‘Look, we didn’t know.’ For God understands all hearts, and he sees you.” (Proverbs 24:12a)

11.

PRIORITIES—determining how to best spend your time.

“How much better to get wisdom than gold, and good judgment than silver!” (Proverbs 16:16)

12.

GROWTH—a process that continues daily, requiring focus, intentionality, and a sense of purpose.
